

Mast Lift COVID-19 plan

Maintain teams as in the past on a given day, boaters on the mast lift schedule will make up the teams. Any boater who feels he (she) is at risk in doing this will be excused from the team but will still be accommodated.

If a boater needs assistance, the boater should have a family member present. If this is not possible, an assistant will be provided from the other boaters. The assistant will help from the bow of the boat only with docking and undocking.

All boaters involved in the mast lift must agree to all rules at all times.

There will be dedicated team leaders who will ensure the rules are being followed.

RULES

The team leader will conduct a safety talk at the beginning of the session.

The team leader will have the right to deny a boat mast lift if the owner refuses to follow all rules.

Team members must distance as much as possible, although in some instances this will not be practical.

Each team member

- Will wear a safety hat. Preferably the member will bring and wear a personally owned hat. Cleaner will be provided to disinfect TNYC hats after use.
- Will wear a face mask.
- Should wear sturdy boots.
- Should wear properly fitting gloves. Hand sanitizer will be provided.
- Should wear safety glasses, preferably wrap-around, unless wearing prescription glasses.

The team leader

- Must follow and enforce all rules.
- Must do a prior check of all mast crane lines to ensure they are properly secured, and must ask another team member to do the check as well.
- Will assign duties to each team member and ensure the duties are carried out as assigned. Duties may be changed from lift to lift.
- Will conduct operations from shore.
